From the foregoing we learn that the Saints are to return, which shows that they would be driven from the land of Zion, otherwise they could not *return* to it. But we are informed in the Doctrine and Covenants that this will not take place until they have passed through "much tribulation."

"But verily I say unto you, I have decreed that your brethren which have been scattered shall return to the land of their inheritances, and build up the waste places of Zion; for after much tribulation, as I have said unto you from their "bondage." in a former communication, cometh the blessing.
